During the season of Lent we remember the price that Jesus paid that we might be able to know God's amazing love. ## IMPORTANT NOTE ABOUT THE APRIL ISSUE OF THE MESSENGER



Make these cute treats as a reminder that Jesus our Savior is also the Lamb of God.




#### What you need:
