FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Some of you may have been wondering what I do on days that are listed as DCOM (District Committee on Ordained Ministry) or PLD (Pastoral Leadership Development). DCOM oversees licensed local pastors, certified lay ministers, and others that are serving in our congregations throughout Albany District. We check in with those under our care to make sure that they have the support that they need to serve their congregations well. We also check to make sure that any coursework that should be done has been done. We are also responsible for any candidate that is intending to take the ordained ministry track – to help them be prepared for their interview with BOOM (Board of Ordained Ministry – Conference level) to become provisional members of the annual conference. There are 30-40 people in our care this year.

PLD is counted as continuing education for all clergy. Those clergy that signed up to take the PLD course this year have met for one Tuesday a month to discuss the books we have read and to determine the best way for each of us to use that information in our setting. The session titles were: Our World Has Changed, Aiming Real Leaders at the Mission Field, Personal Leadership, Streamlining Your Church, Focusing Outward, Preaching, and Real Life Evangelism. Some of the ideas found in these session have already found their way into my work here at Grace. I'm hoping to bring more of my learning into

our work together in the months to come. For those that may want to check out what I've been reading these past 8 months, here is the list: *ReCreating the Church – Leadership for the Postmodern Age* by Richard Hamm; *Direct Hit* by Paul Borden; *Shaped by God's Heart* by Milfred Minatrea; *Simple Church* by Thom Rainer & Eric Geiger; *The Externally Focused Church* by Rick Rusaw & Eric Swanson; *Communicating for a Change* by Andy Stanley & Lane Jones; and *Unbinding the Gospel* by Martha Grace Reese.

I would love to have as many of you as possible to engage with *Unbinding the Gospel*. This would be a wonderful place to begin our journey together in discovering who we are going to become in the days ahead. I look forward growing in faith together.


Why Stewardship?

If we are to take our faith seriously and begin (or continue) to live into our Christian values and principles, then we need to take stewardship seriously. When God created humans, we were created to be stewards of all creation. All that we have belongs to God, and so we must continue to be good stewards of all that is in our care – time, talent, and treasure. Our Trustees are working hard to be good stewards of the property and buildings we have, but we need

to do our share as well. Helping by lending a hand when we are able, offering wisdom and knowledge when appropriate, and helping to keep the building useful for the ministries that God has called us to.

Some of you have concerns about our current budget – noticing the gap between the actual giving and the amount required by our budget to fulfill our financial responsibilities. There have been some unexpected challenges, as the budget was based on last year's giving. We currently have 58 giving units. If each unit was able to give \$5 more each week, we would have an extra \$15,080 for the year. When we think about it, \$5 is less than many spend on coffee or eating out during the week. Also, please consider sending your offering to the church if you will be away. Please be in prayer about your giving, and consider taking a step of faith and giving a bit more.

CROP WALK -and- FOOD PANTRY NEWS

We are all too familiar with the issue of hunger in our community and across America. In order to battle this crisis, Church World Service sponsors CROP Hunger walks across the United States. These community-wide events are organized by schools, businesses, and religious organizations, including our own Grace United Methodist Church. Our CROP Walk was held on May 6th. "The Pantry" at The Church of St. Patrick, directed by Diane Hoffman, has been active for about thirty years. It began in a closet that is now part of the St. Patrick's Thrift Shop as a source of canned food for those in need. Today "The Pantry" has twenty-four volunteers that serve clients three times a week: Tuesday and Friday 10:00AM – 11:00AM, and Wednesday 6:00PM – 7:00PM.

"The Pantry" Statistics for 2017:

- purchased 34,335 pounds of food, which was delivered by Food Express
- Food Shuttle delivered 230 pounds of breads and sweets
- Food Pantries for the Capital District drive/product donations amounted to 3,658 pounds of food
- 1,360 diapers and 118 cans of formula were made available to mothers in need
- Food Pantries for the Capital District donated \$1,689
- FEMA donated \$1,273

No client is ever turned away. Once a month, each client receives twelve meals worth of food. If they are in need of more food that same month, they are given nine more meals. If a person in need is not from our area, they are served and referred to the food pantry in their area. All donations are greatly appreciated.

It's All About Relationship

Let's take a look at Wesley's General Rules in the Discipleship guide:

- 1. **Do no harm** by avoiding evil of every kind.
- 2. **Do good** as often as you can to as many as you can (body & soul).
- 3. **Practice the means of grace** taught to the disciples by Jesus.

The first two are pretty self-explanatory. Doing no harm and doing good are basic positive traits for humanity.

But what about the *means of grace*? They get more specific. They are divided into works of mercy and works of piety. Outward and inward discipleship. Let's look at the outward.

Those works of mercy that John Wesley taught and encouraged are actions.

They require us to get outside. People not of our faith will see these. Regardless of their acceptance of Christianity in general or United Methodism in particular, people can't help but see these as actions that help humanity.

Look at these works and consider how you, your church and your family can make a positive impact on your community.

Feeding the hungry – Can you discover who your community is at risk of hunger and who can join you – or who can you join – to help them? Clothing the naked – Can you supply warm coats or jackets to people whose clothing is inadequate for the weather?

- Caring for the sick Can you drive people to doctor appointments or provide respite care?
- Visiting those in prison Can you go and just sit and talk with someone
- incarcerated, proving they aren't forgotten?
- Sheltering the homeless Can your church building offer a warm meal and a place to sleep?

- Peacemaking Can this start with something as simple as walking
- Welcoming the stranger Can you befriend a lonely newcomer to your town who needs a new friend?

Serving the common good – Can you think of something, just one thing, you can do that will help everyone?

All these works of mercy involve being in a relationship. You can do it. Get out there and show people the works of Jesus.

Coming next time: "Dying is easy, leading is harder."
